After the long wet spring, paddocks and silage ground need to be assessed for weeds. Docks are a never-ending scourge and need to be kept under control to improve sward silage quality. Thistles can also be devastating to paddocks if ignored and early May provides the perfect opportunity to hit young growing thistles before they build up excessive roots underground. Red Clover Silage Scheme

DAFM has opened the Red Clover Silage Scheme for 2024 and we have a Red Clover Silage mix available. If you are reseeding this year, this scheme is a great opportunity to incorporate a red and white clover sward on your farm. The payment is up to €300/Ha for a maximum of 20 Ha per farm. This allows the establishment of a DAFM approved grass seed mix which must include 4kgs of Red Clover per 12 kg pack. Applications are made through BISS (closing date of May 15th) and sward mix must be sown by July 15th.
